RITZY AND GLITZY: The stars fell on BCE Place's Aqua last night. The restaurant was the site of the post-gala party for the Clint Eastwood-produced film, *The Stars Fell On Henrietta*, starring Robert Duvall, Aidan Quinn and Frances Fisher.

The main attraction of the night was the Shriver family (yes, of the Kennedy clan, and Arnold Schwarzenegger's in-laws) who attended the screening, a benefit for Best Buddies. The organization was founded in 1989 by Anthony



Shriver to provide an opportunity for college students and mentally handicapped people to become friends.

Sargent Shriver is proud of his son. "He was conceived when I was 50 years old. It's amazing that a man, at 50, is capable of producing someone like Anthony."

Anthony's mom, Eunice Kennedy-Shriver (JFK's sister), was there too.

The other Shriver kids are doing well too: Mark was elected into the state legislature in Maryland, Tim ran the 1995 World Games in Connecticut, Bob is a record producer, and TV journalist Maria is, of course, Mrs. Schwarzenegger.

"They just bought their fourth home," Sargent said. "And Maria decorated each one herself."

Nephew John F. Kennedy Jr. sent Sargent the premiere issue of his political magazine, *George*, which Sargent brought to read dur-

ing his trip to Toronto.

"I'm not finished reading it, but so far, it's quite good."

Other Aqua guests included Kirstie Alley and Gil Bellows, here in town shooting a movie of the week called *Radiant City*.
